FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state, and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions.

Special Flood Hazard Area Zone:

This project is to repair the Jonesville Greenway park and walking trail back to pre-disaster function within the existing footprint. The park is located in Floodway and AE Floodplain zones (1% Annual Chance Flood Hazard). Confirmation of location in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) was determined by the Yadkin County Flood Insurance Rate Map, Panel Numbers: 3710495100K and 3710496100K, dated 08/18/2009. The proposed work conforms to all applicable State of North Carolina and local floodplain regulations. There is a potential for the facility to be impacted by future flooding events due to its location within the Floodway and AE Floodplain zones. The proposed work will not take place in wetlands per the United States Fish and Wildlife Service National Wetlands Inventory.

Proposed Work and Purpose:

Town of Jonesville will repair a park and walking trail. To minimize future flood damages, Applicant will use best construction practices. Rebuilding using codes and standards reduces the risk of future damages and will restore the facility for use by the community to enjoy the recreational values of the floodplain.

Project Alternatives:

Alternative #1 (no action alternative): The 'no action' alternative would ultimately result in a negative impact on Jonesville Greenway Trail as it is an important social and recreational resource. Additionally, Jonesville Greenway Trail promotes the natural and beneficial values served by the floodplain.

Alternative #2 (relocation): Jonesville Greenway Trail supports open space within the floodplain and would not serve its intended purpose outside of the floodplain.
